STEPS TO GET YOU STARTED AS AN APPOINTED TITLEHOLDER

STEP 1: REVIEW THE ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS AND COMPLETED THE REGISTRATION APPLICATION

I have reviewed, understood, and answered yes to all acknowledgments when I registered for the 2025 Royal American Miss Pageant on www.royalamericanmiss.com. If the delegate is under 18, a parent or guardian completed the acknowledgments and registration. If your state title for your division is already reserved, you will be able to choose a nickname state title to represent. Example: If you live in Georgia and Georgia Preteen is reserved, you will be able to represent "Peach State". Someone from the national office will contact you to complete your registration if your state title is not available. No worries!

STEP 2: I HAVE PAID MY 2025 REGISTRATION FEE

All 2025 delegates must pay the 2025 registration fee of \$50 at www.royalamericanmiss.com under the tab that states, "Enter Now!". This will allow you to open your 2025 account and begin your journey to Royal American Miss Nationals 2025. Once you have completed your registration form, you will visit that same section of the website to complete your payment. Once your registration form and payment have been received, someone from our national office will contact you to confirm your registration.

STEP 3: I HAVE PAID MY FIRST PAYMENT OF THE NATIONAL ENTRY FEE AND I HAVE MARKED THE REMAINING PAYMENT DATES IN MY CALENDAR

Contestants have the choice to submit their full entry fee of \$1,100 at one time or it can be broken down into 4 payments. If a contestant registers after the second payment deadline, the contestant will be required to pay both the first payment and the second payment at the same time. If a contestant registers after the third deadline, they will be required to pay the first, second and third payment at the same time. If the contestant registers after the fourth deadline, the contestant will be required to pay the entry fee in full. Your crown and sash will only be ordered and sent to you after your first payment is complete. Your entry fee includes your state crown, state sash, ad fee, opening number dress, contestant excursion, contestant banquet ticket, contestant show ticket, and lunch and dinner for one day.

PAYMENT #1: Upon confirmation of your registration, all 2025 delegates must pay their first payment of the 2025 entry fee of \$275 at www.royalamericanmiss.com under the tab that states, "Contestant Login" upon their registration being accepted.

PAYMENT #2: \$275 due October 16, 2024 PAYMENT #3: \$275 due January 15, 2025 PAYMENT #4: \$275 due April 16, 2025

Attire Guidance

REGISTRATION & ORIENTATION:

Contestants have 3 choices of colors to wear for registration, including pink, white or silver. All contestants will be introduced during orientation, and we want you to feel your best. Please plan to be "dressy casual", you can wear a sundress, jumpsuit, or a matching set. We want you to think "first impression" and we want you to feel your very best as we are introducing you.

REHEARSALS:

Think "cute and casual" for rehearsals. We want you to be comfortable but keep in mind, we will be getting photos of EVERYTHING, so there is a chance that your photo could be taken during rehearsals.

EXCURSION:

A t-shirt will be provided for you. You will need to bring denim shorts or jeans. The bottoms must be an appropriate length, no rips, tears or designs and they must be blue jean color. No colored denim. If these guidelines are not followed, you will be required to change.

BANQUET:

For the banquet, you will need black-tie, red carpet attire. This is your moment to wear that fun gown that you almost chose but did not because you "thought" it might be a little too much for the stage. We want you to feel beautiful and like a guest of honor. This can be a short formal, floor length dress, or a formal jumpsuit. Our theme this year is a masquerade but feel free to wear what makes you feel the best! Masquerade masks are not required but encouraged.

Required Phases of Competition

EACH REQUIRED COMPETITION COUNTS FOR 1/3 OF YOUR TOTAL SCORE

Interview/Personal Introduction

- Personal interview will be panel-style where you will meet with all of the judges at the same time. You will be standing during interview.
- Contestants will have a 5-minute interview. Contestants will have the opportunity to come into the interview room and use the first minute of their interview to give a personal introduction to our judges. We want our contestants to drive their interview and have a chance to highlight what they truly want the judges to know, including their community service.
- Your Introduction should contain your name, hometown and/ or state, and anything
 you want to highlight about yourself, your volunteer service, your accomplishments or
 your journey. Once again, the goal is for you to set the tone and be in control of your
 interview. Above all strive to be real and let your personality shine!
- There will be a total of 3 professional pageant judges in the room conducting your
 panel interview. This is the best way for the judges to get to know you on a personal
 level and really see your personality shine. The judges want to see the real you, do not
 rehearse your answers; the judges can tell if you are not being genuine.
- Your outfit should be something fresh, simple, and age appropriate. You may wear a
 fashionable business dress or a fashionable pantsuit. Traditional business suits are not
 necessary. No hats, gloves or purses. Shoes should complement the outfit. Make sure
 that you can walk confidently, smoothly, and safely in them.
 - Princess-Jr. Preteen: No noticeable makeup. Only lip gloss is permitted.
 - o Preteen: May wear natural makeup
 - Jr. Teen and Up: Makeup is allowed but must be age appropriate

Remember that you are trying to achieve a polished, put-together look.



Required Phases of Competition

Fashion Runway

- Contestants will model a fun outfit that shows off their personality. It can be anything that you choose: a short dress, high-low dresses, pants, jumpsuit, rompers etc. No swimsuits, denim, or hats! Think "High Fashion New York Runway". You may accessorize as you like, but no props such as umbrellas, purses or bags will be allowed on stage. Each contestant will model their outfit on stage to fun upbeat music. Judges will be looking for contestants' personality on stage, an outfit that shows off the contestants' uniqueness/personality, and contestants' confidence.
- You will have approximately 45 seconds on stage.
- Teen division and Up may wear two-piece outfits but it needs to be age appropriate.

All Divisions: Makeup is allowed and must be age appropriate.



Required Phases of Competition

Evening Gown

- Each contestant will have their moment alone in the spotlight in the formal gown of her choice. You will have approximately 45 seconds on stage.
- All delegates must wear a floor length gown that is age appropriate for the Evening Gown competition.
- Princess-Jr. Teen are required to wear a ballgown (Fitted and flared at the waist)
- Princess-Jr. Teen: No Slits in their formal gown. Teen: A small slit is permitted below the knee. Miss-Elite: Slits can be above the knee but remember to keep it age appropriate. Dresses showing too much skin are discouraged in all age divisions.
- We suggest taking time to get your garments tailored by a professional seamstress to fit your body. Long formals should gently brush the ground, and at most be no more than 1" from the floor. Contestants should not have to hold their gown while walking. Your formal should not puddle on the floor in the front, but should be long enough to cover your shoes.
- Following trends are great, but make sure that you select a dress style and color that compliments your complexion and personality.
- This will be your time to shine and display your grace on stage. Be sure to make eye contact with each judge and show them your beautiful smile.
- Judges will award points based on overall appearance, beauty, poise, stage presence, fashion sense and the contestant's ability to project comfortable elegance.

The Royal American Miss Pageant consists of three preliminary competitions: Interview, Fashion Runway & Evening Gown. Each competition counts as one-third of your total preliminary score. The panel of judges will give a score ranging from 1-10 points in each preliminary category which will determine the top semi-finalists in each division. During finals, the top semifinalists will receive an additional 1-10 points for fun fashion and evening gown which will be added to their overall preliminary score. The total of preliminary scores and final night scores will determine the final placement for the overall top 5. The judges will have the final vote and preliminary scores will assist to break all ties.









Photogenic (\$75 Entry Fee) (Limit 3 Entries)

Do you have a face that the camera loves? Do you love having your picture taken? Then the Photogenic Contest is your chance to show the world what you've got!

- All photos must be in color or black & white.
- Photo submissions must not be larger than an 8x10.
- Your photo should be headshot style.
- Glitz photos are NOT permitted.
- Age appropriate makeup is allowed in all age groups. Photos may be lightly retouched.
- too-mature or demure look generally do not do well.
- You want to achieve "Personality in a Picture." Pictures that convey excitement or emotion often dowell.
- Please have photos in sheet or photo protectors and have your name and division on each photo submitted.

Talent (\$75 Entry Fee) (Limit 2 Entries)

Are you a singer? Dancer? Play an instrument? Do you have any other talent that can be showcased on stage in under 2 minutes? We want to see it! The talent optional is for you!

- The time limit for talent is 2 minutes.
- Age appropriate makeup, outfits, and hand-held props are allowed. No backdrops.
- Music must be family friendly no explicit content.
- All performance music must be uploaded to a Dropbox Folder that will be shared in the Facebook group
- Music must be clipped/faded and not exceed the time limit.
- Anything over 2 minutes cannot be accepted.
- MP3 music files only; we are unable to accept you-tube videos.



Spokesmodel (\$75 Entry Fee) (Limit 2 Entries)

Dur voice is one of the most powerful things we possess. We use our voice to express so many things and by entering the Spokesmodel optional, you have the opportunity to use your voice to speak about something important to you! You will be given a list of topics to choose from that will allow you to showcase your public speaking skills, your charisma and your relatability.

- Your time limit is 90 seconds and your time begins when you reach the podium. Memorizing your
 speech is the ultimate goal but it will be your responsibility to bring a printed version of your speech
 to have with you at the podium.
- As for your attire, you can wear an outfit following the "Interview" guidelines provided for you in the
 required competition section or you can wear the same outfit that you are wearing for interview. The
 choice is completely up to you.
- You will be shown where to enter and exit the stage before your contest begins.
- Age appropriate makeup is allowed for all divisions.

State Wear (\$75 Entry Fee) (Limit 1 Entry)

- Contestants will model an outfit of their choice that represents their state's nickname or theme, landmark or special symbol.
- This is your opportunity to truly showcase something significant to your state. Outfits can be embellished or decorated as the delegate chooses. Think Miss USA or Miss Universe!
- Outfits should be age appropriate. No dangerous props, such as fire or anything that could
 potentially cause harm to others.
- You will have approximately 45 seconds to model your state wear outfit. Use freestyle modeling with turns and walks to reflect your own personal style. At the end of your routine, you will exit the side of the stage. You will be shown where to enter and exit the stage before your contest begins.
- Age appropriate makeup allowed for all divisions.



Casual Wear Modeling (\$75 Entry Fee) (Limit 2 Entries)

- Casual Wearing modeling is exciting, upbeat and will make you feel like you are hitting the runway at New York Fashion Week! This is your chance to shine and show your personal style as you leave it all out on the runway! Should you choose to participate in casual wear, this will give you the opportunity to hit the stage and get in some practice before the main competition.
- In this event, you will model age-appropriate attire that has an upbeat, fashionable look. Shorts,
 pants, rompers, skirts, trendy jeans, and dresses are some examples of clothing you may wear for this
 event. Your outfit can have a theme: back-to-school, sports-related, or other themed outfits.
- This is a Casual Wear contest, not a Formal Wear competition. Sequins, rhinestones, and beads are
 fine if used in a way you would normally see them on trendy, off-the-rack apparel, just don't make
 them the centerpiece of your outfit.
- While props are allowed, they need to be modeled as accessories to the overall outfit theme.
 Swimsuits are not allowed.
- You will have approximately 45 seconds to model your fashionable ensemble. Use freestyle modeling
 with turns and walks to reflect your own personal style. At the end of your routine, you will exit the
 side of the stage. You will be shown where to enter and exit the stage before your contest begins.
- You will bring the outfit of your choice. Also, bring the Casual Wear Modeling Card that you will receive prior to Pageant Check-In. The card will be used by the emcee for narration. It will have spaces on it for you to list your interests and activities, as well as a place to briefly describe the outfi you are wearing. Please be aware the pageant emcee will not read verbatim from the card.
- Age appropriate makeup allowed for all divisions.

Non-Performing Talent (\$75 Entry Fee) (Limit 2 Entries)

Do you have a talent but you are unable to showcase it on stage? We still want to see it!

- You will be able to submit a 2-minute video to our judges to view your talent
- Examples of non-performing talents are any sports related talent (Ice skating, basketball, gymnastics etc.), big instruments (pianos, harp, tuba, etc.), art, cake decorating, etc.
- If the talent is something that is longer than 2 minutes, please create a condensed video displaying progression or highlights of the talent.
- All videos must be uploaded to a Dropbox Folder that will be shared in the Facebook group.



Role Model (\$75 Entry Fee) (Limit 1 Entry)

Do you put in hours on hours of community service because you are a dedicated difference maker? RAM strives to give girls and women a real chance at showcasing their contributions and to truly share their stories with the judges. We know that our contestants will continue to make a difference with or without recognition but we truly believe that everyone deserves recognition. We believe that at some point we all deserve to feel appreciated, as it refuels our motive for continuing to contribute to our community.

- Show the judges what you've been up to during your year (dates applicable from August 1, 2024 -July 8,
- 2025).
- Bring your scrapbook to Registration inclusive of a table of contents and summary page for the judges.
- The inside cover of your scrapbook should contain the Contestant Name and Division.
- Please be sure to give descriptions throughout your scrapbook.

Model Portfolio (\$75 Entry Fee) (Limit 1 Entry)

Different from photogenic, this competition allows you to share more than a headshot! If you are a rising model, we want to see your portfolio. We want to see 4-5 photos, headshots, half body shots, and full body shots. We want to see different emotions!

- Portfolio submissions must not be larger than an 8x10.
- Portfolios should be well developed, should be organized and neat. Your portfolio should be prepared and ready to be submitted.
- Bring your portfolio to registration. The inside cover of your portfolio should contain the Contestant Name and Division.



Crowning the Country (\$75 Entry Fee) (Limit 1 Entry)

Our mission is to crown ambassadors who are prepared and motivated to "crown" their communities by volunteering. We are challenging our state titleholders to truly find out what is needed in their personal community and to develop a plan to address it.

- Contestants will be able to submit a short video stating how becoming a Royal American Miss state itleholder has benefitted her life and how she is making a difference. The video should be no longer han 2 minutes.
- This is your opportunity to be as creative as you wish with your video. We want to get to know you and your purpose.
- All videos must be uploaded to a Dropbox Folder that will be shared in the Facebook group.
